### AWARD

### RECIPIENT GUIDELINES

1. The recipient must demonstrate continued satisfactory academic performance by maintaining a 3.0 GPA in a Texas college or university, completing a minimum of twelve semester hours each semester. The recipient is responsible for acquiring and mailing the following proofs to the Scholarship Chairman of Alamo Mission Chapter, DRT:
  - A. At the beginning of each semester, the recipient is required to submit proof of enrollment in a minimum of twelve semesters hours.
  - B. At the end of each semester, the recipient is required to submit an academic transcript for the semester.
2. The recipient may forfeit the award if the requirements listed above are not met or if the recipient leaves the college or university for any reason. Alamo Mission Chapter, DRT will notify the recipient if the requirements are not met. The recipient will then have 30 days to prove continued eligibility.
3. The award will be mailed directly to the financial offices of the college or university at the beginning of each semester after the Scholarship Chairman has received the required proofs listed above.

**KEEP THIS FORM FOR FUTURE REFERENCE**

The Alamo Mission Chapter Scholarship is to be awarded by the Alamo Mission Chapter, DRT, to one high school senior who has demonstrated outstanding scholarship and leadership. The recipient will enroll as an undergraduate in a Texas college or university in the fall semester following high school graduation. The award will be a maximum of \$4,000.00 (\$500.00 per semester for four years.)

### ELIGIBILITY

1. **SCHOLARSHIP:** Applicants must have proven scholastic ability and must have ranked in the upper 10 percent of their class at the end of their junior year in high school.
2. **LEADERSHIP:** Applicants must have demonstrated leadership ability in school, community or part-time and/or summer work.
3. **HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION:** Applicants must be graduating seniors in May/June of the current school from an accredited high school in the San Antonio area.
4. **COLLEGE ADMISSION:** Applicants must meet all requirements for admission to a college or university located in the state of Texas for the purpose of undergraduate work in the fall semester following high school graduation.
5. **APPLICATION FOLDER:** Applicants must prepare an application folder as prescribed in the following instructions and submit it directly to the DRT Scholarship committee for evaluation.

## FORMAT FOR APPLICATION FOLDER

Please read carefully: All of the following information and documentation is required. The information must be typed, arranged by sections (I-V) in the prescribed sequence, and fastened in a plain pocket folder.

### Section I - Personal

1. Full Name
2. Social Security Number
3. Birth (Include month, date, year, city, state, country)
4. Permanent address (include street, city, state, zip code)
5. Telephone number
6. Names of parents (give address if different from #4)
7. Name, address and telephone number of your high school
8. Projected graduation date from high school
9. Name and location of intended college or university

### Section II - General

10. List in the order of importance to you no more than five awards or honors received during high school.
11. List volunteer participation in community, charitable or religious activities and/or organizations (no more than five) during the past two years.
12. Enclose a letter or recommendation from a person in your school or community, other than a relative, describing your character.

### Section III - Scholarship

13. Give scores for college admission on tests you have taken. If you have not taken tests, please so state and give reasons.
14. Give class rank and/or percentile at then end of your junior year.

15. Provide a copy of your high school transcript as of the end of your junior year. This must be an official transcript, stamped and signed by a school official. If necessary, this transcript may be enclosed in a sealed envelope.
16. Provide one letter of recommendation from a teacher or school administrator describing your scholastic abilities.

### Section IV - Leadership

17. List in the order of importance to you: five high school and community activities and summer/part-time work which have led to the development of your leadership abilities. Include offices held, volunteer responsibilities and paid employment.
18. Provide one letter of recommendation from a teacher, community leader, administrator or employer describing your leadership abilities.

### Section V - Essay

19. Topic: **WHY TEXAS HISTORY IS IMPORTANT TO ME**
  - A. The essay is to be your personal reflection on Texas history - how historical events and personallities have shaped your values, attitudes and behaviors. It is not to be a research paper about heroes and events.
  - B. The essay will be judged on (1) content; (2) written communication skills and originality; (3) grammar, spelling, punctuation and appearance.
  - C. The essay should be 1 1/2 - 2 TYPEWRITTEN pages using double-spaced standard size paper. Use 8 1/2 x 11" paper, one side only, with 1" margins.

### SUBMITTING APPLICATION

20. Review the application information, and make sure that your folder is complete. It must be in the prescribed format, and include the required information, letters of recommendation, academic transcript and essay.
21. The application should be submitted as soon as possible. It must be postmarked **NO LATER THAN FEBRUARY 8, 2008.**
